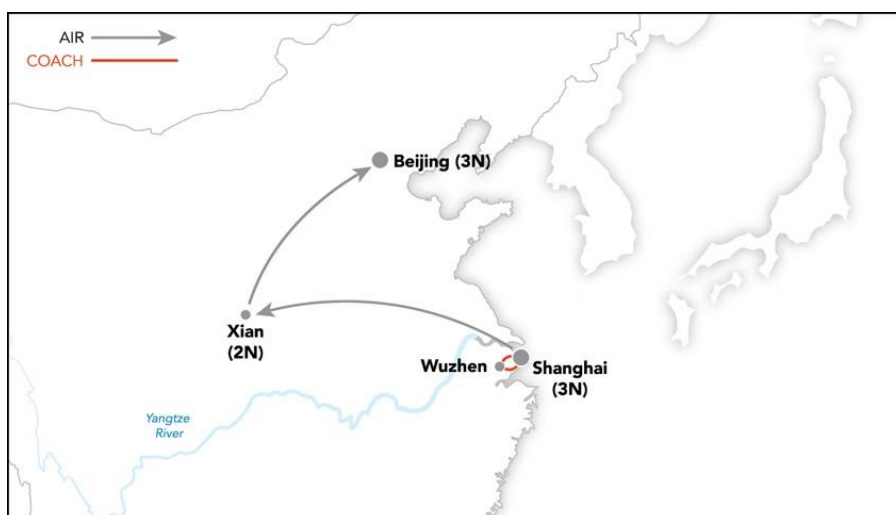

This document is designed to be read in conjunction with the other pre-departure information provided by Wendy Wu Tours including the tour itinerary as described in our brochure and/or website. If there are any particular challenges, from the length of time spent on your feet, the length of drives and flights, to the standard of remote accommodation; they will be explained here.

All passengers must read this document to ensure the itinerary is suitable for their interests and physical capabilities. This is not your final itinerary and therefore does not mention all the sites visited.



Welcome to Wendy Wu Tours

China continues to amaze, fascinate and thrill our passengers, many of whom have travelled to one country in Asia with us, then another, year after year. We urge you to keep in mind all the rewards, as well as challenges of travelling in a country with a history, culture and attitude so unlike your own.

A typical day's sightseeing may include the bustle and noise of a city street, sights and smells of a local market and interacting with the locals. Travelling in China requires patience and potential delays are to be expected due to standards of service. There is a low level of English spoken throughout China, so your Local Guides will be indispensable during your trip.

Almost everything will be different to what you may be used to. We have found that our passengers who embark with a sense of humour and adventure, who accept that things do not always go to plan, are those who find their experience most rewarding. It is essential that all passengers recognize the demands of factors such as basic facilities and cultural differences they may encounter in some areas.

Classical China with Shangri-La - Comfortable Pace

These tours are accessible to most people with an average level of fitness and normal mobility. They involve sightseeing on foot and some climbing of stairs.

This tour is not strenuous, and can be taken at the pace, and according to the abilities of passengers travelling in your party. If any member of your party has mobility difficulties, please advise Wendy Wu Tours, so that our operators can be made aware, and may rearrange the itinerary to suit your needs. If at any point during the tour you feel you are being rushed, or not moving fast enough, please let your Local Guide know, so that they may adjust the touring accordingly and provide you with the best experience possible. Similarly, as you are travelling on a private basis, if you would like to change the touring, dates, timings, please speak to your reservations consultant, prior to travelling, or speak to your local guide whilst in China.

NB: Please note that times and distances listed in the tour dossier are approximate.

Days 1: Arrive in Shanghai

You will be met at Pudong Airport in the Arrivals Hall by your Local Guide from Wendy Wu Tours. Transfer (approx. 1hr drive) to your 5* Shangri-La Shanghai hotel. The rest of your afternoon is at leisure to relax in your resort or explore the city.

Day 2: Shanghai – Wuzhen

Today, drive 3 hours to the water canal town of Wuzhen. Sightseeing here is leisurely and involves several hours exploring on foot. Return to Shanghai in the afternoon and enjoy an afternoon at leisure..

Breakfast and Lunch

Day 3: Shanghai

Sightseeing today involves a full day of touring around the centre of the city including 4-5hrs on foot. You will visit the Yu Gardens, the Old Town, Shanghai Museum, the Bund, Xintiandi and have the opportunity for some shopping around Nanjing Road. Be mindful of your valuables while in the Old Town as it is very crowded. This evening take a cruise on the Huangpu River.

Breakfast and Lunch

Day 4: Shanghai to Xian

Any time before your airport transfer this morning is at leisure. You will transfer to the airport and fly to Xian (flight approx. 2.5hrs). Transfer to your Shangri-La Xian hotel (1hr drive) and check-in. This evening enjoy a Shui Jiao dumpling meal before watching a Tang Dynasty dancing show.

Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner

Day 5: Xian

The Museum of the Terracotta Warriors and Horses is located more than a 1hr drive outside of Xian. From the bus park to the museum entrance is a 15min walk. There are electric carts offered by private vendors which can be organised at your own cost. There is no electric cart available for the return from the museum exit to the bus park. Within the museum area the warriors can be seen in 3 different 'pits', which are active archaeological digs. The site is large and, towards the summer months, can be hot outside. Sightseeing here involves approx. 2.5hrs on foot. This afternoon you will visit the City Wall. The Local Guide will give you time to explore at your own pace. There are options here to hire a bicycle or an electric cart to drive along the length of the wall. These are offered by private vendors and can be organised at your own expense.

Breakfast and Lunch

Day 6: Xian to Beijing

Sightseeing at the Little Wild Goose Pagoda and Shaanxi Museum involves at least 2.5hrs walking. Be mindful of your valuables while in the Muslim Quarter's alley market stalls. In the afternoon you will transfer to the airport and fly to Beijing (flight duration 1hr, 40mins). From Beijing airport, transfer (1hr drive) to your Shangri-La Beijing hotel for check-in. Enjoy the rest of your day at leisure.

Breakfast and Lunch

Day 7: Beijing

Sightseeing around the centre of Beijing involves 3-4hrs walking during the morning to see Tiananmen Square and the Forbidden City. This afternoon, visit the Temple of Heaven where there will be at least 1hr on foot. Watch a Chinese acrobatics show this evening.

Breakfast and Lunch

Day 8: Beijing

You will rise early this morning to drive 2hrs (60km) northwest of the city to the Juyongguan Pass section of the Great Wall. The aim of this is to avoid the crowds of tourists

who will arrive later in the morning, and the heat of the day. Your visit here involves walking from the bus to the first section. After you have been given an introduction to the Great Wall's unique history you will have free time to explore the rest at your own pace. After lunch, drive 1.5hrs to the Summer Palace in the north of the city. The palace is set over an extensive park and man-made lake complex and there is 1.5-2hrs on foot involved at this site. This evening, dine on Peking Duck, a favourite of the Qing Emperors and a Beijing classic.

Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner

Day 9: Depart Beijing

Any time before your flight is at leisure. You will be transferred from your hotel to the airport, according to the departure time of your international flight.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION**Before You Leave**

Itinerary Changes - The order of events and sightseeing may vary according to local conditions or for operational purposes. The schedules of the domestic airlines in China are subject to frequent changes. For this reason, we have indicated approximate times only. Your Local Guide will inform you of any schedule changes as they are informed of them. Roads in China have generally been improved over recent years, but some road construction and/or weather conditions may still lengthen the driving times.

Visas - A visa is required for entry into China. A standard visa processing service is included in your tour cost. We will require your passport, completed visa application form, and 1 passport photo, taken within the last 6 months, to process your visa. We will require all this information 8 weeks prior to departure. As per our standard visa processing service, we will have your passport for at least 4 weeks. Any passports and visa applications that require an express 2 week service, or that are received in our office less than 6 weeks prior to departure will incur a £50 per passport express fee. In rare cases, you may be required to provide further information or documentation to the Chinese embassy and or be required to attend an interview at the embassy in London. If this is the case we will notify you as soon as possible.

Please note that if you intend to arrive more than 24 hours before your tour commences or intend to stay in China after your tour has ended and **you are NOT staying in a hotel** you will need to register with the local Public Security Bureau. If you are staying in a hotel, registration is done on your behalf as part of the check-in process.

Vaccinations and Your Health - We recommend that you contact either your local GP or a travel doctor for advice on vaccinations and travel health. www.fitfortravel.nhs.uk is a comprehensive website that you may also find useful.

Climate - Please refer to our website or brochure for detailed temperature charts.

Insurance - It is a condition of booking with us that you take out suitable travel insurance. You must provide us with the name of your insurer, policy number and their 24 hour emergency contact number when you book with us or as soon as possible thereafter. Wendy Wu Tours will not be liable for any costs incurred by you due to your failure to take out suitable travel insurance from the date of booking.

What to Expect on Tour

Development - Although China is developing quickly, it still lacks international standards of civil infrastructure and tourist facilities. For example, you may see a hole in the road without a warning sign or safety barricade; concepts of personal responsibility are also different to those in the UK. Consequently, tourist and public facilities may not uphold the same safety standards as in the UK. However, all of our suppliers meet local safety standards as a minimum. We want you to have an enjoyable holiday so we ask that you take extra care, use your common sense as well as refer to notices and follow advice from your Local Guides.

Accommodation - Your accommodation throughout your tour will be 5* Shangri-La Hotels & Resorts.

Tipping - As with most countries, tipping is a way of life in China. For private tours we recommend an amount of US \$5 per person per day for tipping to be distributed amongst drivers, restaurants, guides etc. This amount is at your own discretion.

Meals - Some meals are included in our private tours, please see inclusions above. If you would like to travel on a fully inclusive meal basis please speak to Wendy Wu Tours, to arrange this prior to travel. Included meals are designed so that you can experience the local dishes, their individual flavours as well as the different ways they are prepared and cooked throughout China. For meals not included, local guides will be happy to assist with recommendations on where and what to eat in order to fully appreciate this vastly different cuisine.

Optional Extras - Our tours are planned to be as inclusive as possible. However, from time-to-time your Local Guide may suggest optional tours/sightseeing in addition to the standard sightseeing planned for that city. Such options are at an additional cost, with prices ranging from 100-300 Yuan per person (payable in local currency). If you do not wish to take part in any optional extras, you will have the option of enjoying some free time at leisure or to return to the hotel.

Personal Expenses- You will need to take some extra money to cover drinks, laundry and souvenirs, plus any additional sightseeing that may be offered to you. Based on the advice of previous customers an approximate amount of £150 per week should be sufficient; however for those that can't resist a bargain, consider allocating a higher amount.

After Your Booking

Once you have booked with Wendy Wu Tours, you will receive a confirmation invoice followed by deposit documentation, which includes a visa application form, help sheet, and a China travel guide & phrasebook. Your final documentation pack will be sent to you approx. 2 weeks prior to departure, and will include a travel wallet, badge, lanyard, suggested packing list, feedback form and a phrase book, along with your final itinerary.

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
